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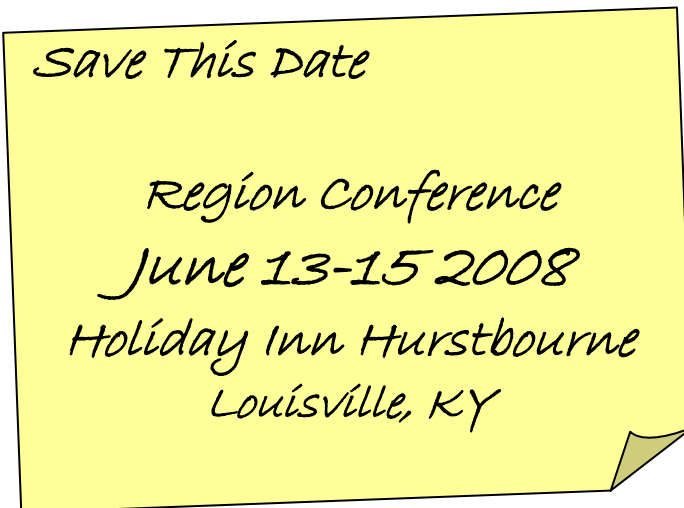

**Region Dues**

Have you wondered what your \$15.00 Region Dues get you? Quite a lot, actually. The dues help pay for the Leadership Seminar every October and plan for the Regional Conference in June. The dues pay for the Heart of America ITC Website and provide eligibility for members in the Region to vote on important issues affecting ITC nationally and internationally at Convention. As a block, we can effectively make the changes needed to continue ITC into the twenty first century.

Heart of America dues are still \$15 per adult club member and \$5.00 per Zenith club member. The dues have remained the same since first adopted in 2001. Life members also must pay Region dues of \$15. In accordance with current HAR Bylaws, dues for new members joining during the ITC term are paid on a pro rata basis, as follows:

February 1 – April 30	\$7.50
May 1 – July 31	\$3.75

### ADVERTISING MAKES A BAD BUSINESS FAIL SOONER

This is a saying that an instructor I once worked with used about advertising. If you advertise, you must be able to deliver. If not, word gets around even more quickly, and your business fails sooner – rather than later.

What has all this to do with ITC and POWERtalk? Simply this – unless we deliver what we advertise – by word of mouth, newspaper, or poster – we may never get another chance with that prospect. The old cliché is correct: You never get a second chance to make a first impression.

Good or bad, we are judged immediately by a visitor to our club, council or region meeting. Are they getting what they were promised? If not, is it better? If it is not better, it is unlikely they will return. Another problem is that when someone has a bad experience, they are likely to share it with at least 11 people. When it is a good experience, the average is 3. Can we afford to alienate an additional 11 people with a bad meeting or presentation? With the first person,

that makes an even dozen – enough for a thriving club!

So what do we do? First, we look at ourselves – critically. What do we say to our visitors and members? Are we there to assist them to become better, or is it an ego trip to make our numbers look good? When we remember what we can offer others and help them partake, we all become BETTER. It is unavoidable. We never really know how familiar we are with a situation until we explain it to others.

Second, we make the changes necessary to becoming a welcoming group, a growing group. What obstacles are in our path? What needs to be done to alleviate them? Once identified, obstacles then become opportunities. Opportunities to solve, grow in ability, and expand horizons for ourselves and the group. It is not always easy. In fact, it is very difficult at times, but attitude has much to do with the success achieved. If we want to do something strongly enough, we will find a way to ACHIEVE our goal.

Last, celebrate. When achievements are reached either by the individual or the group, celebrate them. They are the result of personal or professional SUCCESS. Tell the world – everyone wants to get on a bandwagon that's going somewhere. Have the chart visible showing the achievement – send a press release about the success. SHARE your enthusiasm.

### Remember enthusiasm is contagious: SPREAD IT!

## 2008 ITC WRITING CONTEST-HEART OF AMERICA REGION

It is not too early to begin writing your entry for 2008. At this point, there are no changes in the Writing Contest rules as published on the website. Please check the website for last minute changes.

### BASIC RULES ARE:

FICTION AND NON-FICTION	POETRY
No fewer than 500 words and no more than 1500 words.	No fewer than 10 lines and no more than 32 lines – metric or free verse.

Entries can be computer generated or type-written on one side of 8 1/2 X 11 white paper, double spaced with a one inch margin on all sides. Entries need to include an eligibility statement signed by your President/Treasurer. In addition, a separate sheet of paper should include your name, address, club, council, region, title and type of entry. No identification should be included on the entry itself. Four copies of your entry should be forwarded to the Region Chairman.



### **DEADLINE IS MARCH 1, 2008**

Please send in your entries a few days prior to this deadline to assure receipt prior to the deadline. Please include your e-mail address so confirmation of receipt can be sent to you.

**Any entries received after March 1<sup>st</sup> will not be entered in the contest.**

It is not too early NOW to start writing your entry. The more time you spend on it, the better will be your effort. Please proof read your entry to make sure that your sentence structure and word intent is correct. Spell check does not catch many of these situations. Let's have a number of winners in every category. No one entered Fiction writing last year, so we do need some skillful and creative minds to set themselves into fabricating a fiction piece.
